Symptoms persisted, family moved to the USA, and he underwent a recto-sigmoid resection and a pullthrough for "Hirschsprung" + cecostomy tube insertion.

Histopathologic findings = normal ganglion cells.



Symptoms persisted, and the family moved to another State.




 A redo pullthrough was performed, cecostomy was closed and a neoappendicostomy was opened.

7 dilations under anesthesia.
















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
